Upon course completion, participants will be able to:

- Identify crucial elements of CMS required documentation for IRF or skilled care and verbalize interventions to advance the level of documentation skills of the rehab team.
- Describe principles of a High Reliable Organization (HRO), identify ways to develop for an HRO in rehabilitation, as well as verbalize the difference between PhD and DNP in nursing.
- Describe how to develop a research question and test for feasibility, describe the impact of clinical research on patient outcomes and describe how to integrate research into the time demands of the clinical nursing practice.
- Describe how to assess a patient/caregiver learning readiness and recognize when patient/caregiver understanding of information presented.
- Verbalize levels of care within the continuum, identify medical and functional criteria utilized in transitioning a patient to the appropriate level of care while examining the impact cost to the provider in the healthcare delivery system.
- Discuss insight into overcoming limitations, both cognitive and physical, following a stroke, describe the benefits of volunteerism following personal illness and understand how previous talent and work knowledge is applied through current volunteer work.
